**\*\*\*MINUTES\*\*\***

**Presentation and discussion with representatives for the Department of Environmental Protection on the Gowanus Canal Area High Level Storm Sewer Capital project (SEK-20067), a project designed to correct and improve flooding conditions in the 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Avenue corridors between Douglass and State Streets.**

Jim Garin, Director of Engineering at the Department of Environmental Protection explained High Level Storm Sewers. Essentially, the plan is to build a new sewer line to capture storm water entering catch basins between 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Avenues on about 15 blocks from State Street to Carroll Street in 2 phases.

- Phase I – Carroll Street to Baltic Street design in FY2012 construction in FY2013
- Phase II – Baltic Street to State Street – design FY2019 construction FY2020

There is one already built in the Bronx in Community Board 10. This appears to have, at least, a small effect of reducing CSO's and flooding in nearby areas in the event of a 5 year rainfall.

A motion was made by Glenn Kelly and seconded by Hildegard Link to approve the minutes of the last meeting held on May 30, 2012.
